



Library Page Turners

- The book is better than the movie.
- 133 million folks attend public library programs.
- 68% of Americans have a library card.
- There are more public libraries (16,568) than Starbucks (8,791).
- 90% of Americans say closing the library would impact them/family.



- Life expectancy-79 years of age.
- Daily -10,000 individuals turn 65.
- Americans 65 and older will double from 46 million to over 98 million by 2060.
- 80% have at least one chronic condition.
- Major sources of income are social security (84%), income from assets (63%) and private pensions (37%).
- Most women 65 and older live alone.
- 2030 Older folks will outnumber children.

- Can efforts be evaluated?

- Select themes for programs that deal with specific interests of the audience.
- Create engaging programs that promote "lifelong" earning?
- Tie efforts into community need/SDOH.
