
OATS Timeline



- Consider the technology, including audio, video, and other collaboration tools
- Angles and room dynamics matter think of it as a production!
- Incorporate lessons learned from fully virtual programs to ease the transition to hybrid

- Live at your facility with in person participants and a virtual audience tuning in
- Live at another facility or at a presenter's home and you have a live audience and/or a virtual audience at your facility

Benefits & Challenges of Hybrid Programming

- You can reach a much broader audience then just in person when you eliminate the barriers of driving, driving to an unfamiliar location, getting up early, scheduling conflicts, etc.
- You open the door to many more opportunities for older adults.
- Your program attendance increases when you offer programs as hybrid.
- It can be time consuming to set up, test, trouble shoot, etc.
- Technology issues! No sound, no video, poor internet connection.

Setting up for a successful Hybrid Program

- Select the right room for the program
- Sound system, speakers, microphones
- Camera Position & Screen What does the audience need to see and hear?
- Speaker/Presenter Best position in the room


Tips & Lessons Learned

- Do a dry run in advance
- Know your computer's settings and device names (microphone, speaker, camera)
- Have someone assist with technical issues during the program. Have them monitor chat, background noise, talking, unmuting themselves, etc.
- Train a staff or a volunteer to set up hybrid programs
- Teach your instructors how to set up hybrid programs
- Make sure participants know how to use your platform and how to "pin" the presenter.
- Most if not all programs can be hybrid!
